Through last week, the total number of positive cases of Totowa residents is 1,188. This figure is 282 higher than my last message to you. This past week, we had 35 positive cases and our town has been trending lower, which is good news. But we must stay vigilant with the preventive measures we have been practicing as restrictions continue to loosen.

By now you know that the corona virus vaccine is in short supply and demand outstrips the supply. Hopefully, with new vaccines being approved, there will be more available to all of us. The NJ Department of Health has established a COVID vaccine website where residents can go to sign up and pre-register for the vaccine. The website to register is <https://covidvaccine.nj.gov>. The phone number is (855) 568-0545. Information related to the distribution of the vaccine and other pertinent information can be found there. Passaic County has also established a website for County residents and the website address is [PassaicCountyNJ.org](http://PassaicCountyNJ.org) and you click on vaccine information to register. Their phone number is (973) 881-2790. And you can register for the City of Paterson vaccination center at this same site as Paterson has vaccines delivered weekly.
