# MINUTES OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL

Mayor John Coiro called the meeting to order and asked the Municipal Clerk to call the roll.

Municipal Clerk Wassel recited the Prayer of the Meeting followed with the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag with the public participating.

Mayor Coiro asked the Clerk to read the statement of the meeting.

Municipal Clerk Wassel read the following statement: This meeting of the Mayor and Council held on this day is being held in accordance with Chapter 231, P.L. 1975 of the State of New Jersey as amended. The agenda for this meeting has been prepared and distributed to the Mayor and Council and a copy has been on file in the Office of the Municipal Clerk.

There was a motion by Councilman D'Angelo, seconded by Councilman Picarelli to dispense with the regular order of business in order to enable the Mayor and Council to present a Proclamation In Honor Of Ray Keeley Being Named Plumbing Inspector Of The Year and to hold a public hearing on Ordinance No. 12-2025 as advertised. On roll call vote, all members of the Council present voted in the affirmative.

Mayor Coiro asked Ray Keeley to approach the dais and commented how it is very nice that one of Totowa's own has been honored as Plumbing Inspector of the year, but that Ray is sort of like a chameleon – in a good way – because in addition to being a plumber, he was a police officer, firefighter, on the first aid squad, the owner of many properties

and is now the plumbing inspector for many towns. The Mayor went on to read some excerpts from the proclamation and then presented it to him and congratulated Ray on this honor.

Ray Keeley thanked the Mayor and Council and then explained how his nomination came about. He said he really appreciates the proclamation and that he loves everything he does for Totowa.

WHEREAS, The Educational Services Commission of New Jersey ("ESCNJ Co-op") has awarded Contract No. ESCNJ 22/23-11 to Foveonics Documents Solutions ("Foveonics"), 99 Grayrock Road, Clinton, New Jersey 08809 for electronic document records management systems; and

WHEREAS, Foveonics has submitted a proposal for a Records Management Service and Solution Plan for the Tax Assessor Office in the amount of \$77,401.73; a copy of which is on file in the office of the Borough of Totowa Municipal Clerk; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the applicable New Jersey State laws, this contract may be authorized without public bidding.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Totowa do hereby authorize the Borough of Totowa to enter into a contract with Foveonics to provide a Records Management Service and Solution Plan for the Tax Assessor Office in the amount of \$77,401.73.

WHEREAS, IDEMIA has submitted a proposal dated August 4, 2025 for the purchase and installation of a LiveScan System for the Police Department in the amount of \$22,609.00, a copy of which is on file in the office of the Borough of Totowa Municipal Clerk: and

WHEREAS, the IDEMIA LiveScan System is compatible with Federal Sex Offender Registration and Notification Act as well as the New Jersey State Police and FBI databases; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Totowa desire to authorize the purchase and installation of this new system and related accessories which will be used by the officers of the Borough of Totowa Police Department; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the applicable New Jersey State laws, the purchase and installation of this equipment may be authorized without public bidding.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Totowa do hereby accept the proposal from IDEMIA for the purchase and installation of an IDEMIA LiveScan System and related accessories for the Borough of Totowa Police Department in the amount of \$22,609.00.

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Totowa have determined that there is a need for this innovative equipment which will assist our volunteer firefighters as they respond to emergency calls; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Totowa desire to authorize the purchase and installation of the new Knox Key Defender Units for the Fire Department; and

WHEREAS, Knox Company, 1601 W. Deer Valley Road, Phoenix, Arizona 85027 has submitted a proposal for the purchase and installation of six Knox Key Defender Units for the Fire Department in the amount of \$6,120.00, a copy of which is on file in the office of the Brough of Totowa Municipal Clerk; and
