MINUTES OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL

April 28, 2026

PRESENT: Mayor John Coiro, presiding, Council President Lou D'Angelo, Councilman Anthony Picarelli, Councilman William Bucher, Councilman Patrick Fierro, Councilman Sanders Reynoso, Councilwoman Kristen Coiro, Municipal Clerk Joseph Wassel and Municipal Attorney Kristin Corrado.

ABSENT: None.

Mayor John Coiro called the meeting to order and asked the Municipal Clerk to call the roll.

Municipal Clerk Wassel recited the Prayer of the Meeting followed with the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag with the public participating.

Mayor Coiro asked the Clerk to read the statement of the meeting.

Municipal Clerk Wassel read the following statement: This meeting of the Mayor and Council held on this day is being held in accordance with Chapter 231, P.L. 1975 of the State of New Jersey as amended. The agenda for this meeting has been prepared and distributed to the Mayor and Council and a copy has been on file in the Office of the Municipal Clerk.

There was a motion by Councilman D'Angelo, seconded by Councilman Picarelli to dispense with the regular order of business in order to hold a public hearing on Ordinance Nos. 06-2026 & 07-2026 as advertised. On roll call vote, all members of the Council present voted in the affirmative.

Municipal Clerk Wassel announced that Ordinance Nos. 06-2026 & 07-2026 have been advertised for public hearing for Tuesday, April 28, 2026.

Municipal Clerk Wassel read the legal notice and the title of Ordinance No. 06-2026.

There was a motion by Councilman D'Angelo, seconded by Councilman Picarelli to open the public hearing. On roll call vote, all members of the Council present voted in the affirmative.

There was a motion by Councilman D'Angelo, seconded by Councilman Picarelli to adopt Ordinance No. 06-2026 on second and final reading. On roll call vote, all members of the Council present voted in the affirmative.

There was a motion by Councilman D'Angelo, seconded by Councilman Picarelli to adopt Ordinance No. 07-2026 on second and final reading. On roll call vote, all members of the Council present voted in the affirmative.

There was a motion by Councilman D'Angelo, seconded by Councilman Picarelli to revert to the regular order of business. On roll call vote, all members of the Council present voted in the affirmative.

Mayor Coiro asked if any members of the Council, the Municipal Clerk or the Municipal Attorney wished to address the Council.

Councilman Reynoso: Announced the following two events that he couldn't attend, but heard about: 1) The Open House at the Library had a great turnout; 2) That the Car Show on the Boulevard had a record turnout with over 200 vehicles and thanked all the volunteers and the Police. Mayor Coiro: Concurred, but said there are a couple of things that need to be tweaked going forward.

There was a motion by Councilman D'Angelo, seconded by Councilman Picarelli to approve the Minutes of the Mayor and Council for the meeting of April 14, 2026. On roll call vote, all members of the Council present voted in the affirmative. Councilman Bucher abstained from the voting.

COMMITTEE ON FINANCE:

There was a motion by Councilman Picarelli, seconded by Councilman D'Angelo to approve Resolution No. 2026-10 for the payment of bills. On roll call vote, all members of the Council present voted in the affirmative.

There was a motion by Councilman Picarelli, seconded by Councilman D'Angelo to adopt the following Resolution Authorizing The Mayor To Sign The Certification To Comply With The Requirements Set Forth In N.J.A.C. 7:26A-11. On roll call vote, all members of the Council present voted in the affirmative.

RESOLUTION NO. 75-2026

WHEREAS, the Clean Communities and Recycling Act of 1981 created the Municipal Tonnage Grant (MTG) program, whereby municipalities could receive a grant for the amount of materials documented as being recycled during the previous calendar year; and

WHEREAS, in 1987, the New Jersey Statewide Mandatory Source Separation and Recycling Act, specifically N.J.S.A. 13:1E-99.16, mandated the governing body of each municipality to submit an annual Recycling Tonnage Report summarizing the amount of material recycled during the previous calendar year; and

WHEREAS, in January 2008, the Recycling Enhancement Act (REA), N.J.S.A. 13:1E-96, specifically P.L. 2007, c. 311, reestablished funding for local recycling programs through a tax of \$3.00 per ton on all solid waste accepted for disposal or transfer at solid waste facilities in New Jersey except those designed exclusively to transport waste by railroad (N.J.S.A. 13:1E-96.5); and

WHEREAS, the REA requires that a Certified Recycling Coordinator (CRC-sometimes referred to as a Certified Recycling Professional-CRP) certify recycling tonnage reports, specifies that grants received may only be expended on recycling (N.J.S.A. 13:1E-96(b)1) and that the amount of grant monies received by the municipality shall not be less than the annual amount of recycling tax paid by the municipality (N.J.S.A. 13:1E-96(b)1); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 13:1E-96a, the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP), Division of Solid and Hazardous Waste (DSHW) administers the MTG program; and

WHEREAS, the DEP implemented several changes to the program beginning with the 2017 MTG application, and whereby now a complete 2025 MTG application consists of: a 2025 Recycling Tonnage Report; an Expenditure Report for 2022 MTG funds; a statement that the municipality complied in calendar year 2025 with the Standards for Municipalities and intends to comply with same in calendar year 2026; a statement that the Municipal Recycling Coordinator (MRC) complied with the program requirements during calendar year 2025 and intends to comply with same during calendar year 2026.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Municipal Council of the Borough of Totowa, County of Passaic, New Jersey does hereby authorize Mayor John Coiro to sign the Certification of Compliance (N.J.A.C. 7:26A-11 "Standards for Municipalities").

COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC SAFETY:

WHEREAS, Public Service Electric and Gas Company, 1 Taft Road, Totowa, New Jersey, 07512, Block 169.02, Lot 1 has made application for their Jackson Road Substation to Cedar Grove Substation, 230 kV Underground Electric Transmission Line Project; and

WHEREAS, the project is approximately 4.8 miles in length and will include the construction and installation of new underground electric duct banks and manhole vaults, mostly in low lying areas or adjacent to surface water ways with anticipated shallow groundwater conditions, so dewatering and water management during construction will be required; and

WHEREAS, Public Service Electric and Gas Company, is required to apply to the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP) for a Treatment Works Approval (TWA) for the temporary treatment and discharge from dewatering activities into the Preakness Brook and Passaic River; and

WHEREAS, the Treatment Works Approval (TWA) permit application has been reviewed and approved by the Borough Engineer.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Totowa, County of Passaic, State of New Jersey that the Mayor of the Borough of Totowa be and is hereby authorized to execute the Statements of Consent – NJDEP Form WQM-003 on behalf of the Borough of Totowa.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING HVAC AND BOILER
PREVENTATIVE MAINTENANCE AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, the Borough of Totowa Municipal Clerk has recommended that the Borough of Totowa initiate a Preventative Maintenance Program for the HVAC systems located at various municipal owned buildings; and

WHEREAS, these buildings include the Borough of Totowa Municipal Complex, Community Center, DPW building, Fire Rescue Firehouse and Lincoln Avenue Firehouse; and

WHEREAS, 454 Mechanical, LLC, 14 Masklee Court, Totowa, New Jersey 07512 has submitted a proposal to perform the HVAC preventative maintenance services for the sum of \$7,175.00 plus materials, a copy of which is on file in the office of Borough of Totowa Municipal Clerk; and

WHEREAS, the Maintenance Program includes four maintenance visits per year, pressurized coil cleaning of all air-conditioning equipment and boiler maintenance annually; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Totowa desire to establish an HVAC Preventative Maintenance Program for the Borough of Totowa municipal owned buildings; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the applicable New Jersey State laws, the preventative maintenance services may be authorized without public bidding.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Totowa do hereby accept the proposal submitted by 454 Mechanical, LLC for HVAC Preventative Maintenance services for the Borough of Totowa municipal owned buildings in accordance with their proposal.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Municipal Council of the Borough of Totowa does hereby authorize the Mayor and Municipal Clerk to execute any and all instruments

A letter was received from the Totowa Seniors requesting permission to use the Municipal Parking Lot on Tuesday, May 5, 2026 for a bus trip to Wind Creek Casino in Bethlehem, PA. RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING EXECUTION OF AFFORDABLE HOUSING DEED RESTRICTION FOR THE PROPERTY LOCATED AT BLOCK 11, LOT 9.01 ON THE OFFICIAL TAX MAP OF THE BOROUGH OF TOTOWA

WHEREAS, Shepherds Lane Commons, LLC, 300 Indian Trail Drive, Franklin Lakes, New Jersey 07417 is constructing a development known as Shepherds Lane Commons located at 95 Shepherds Lane and officially designated as Block 11, Lot 9.01 on the official Tax Map of the Borough of Totowa ("Property"); and

WHEREAS, said development consists of a total of 74 condominium units with 15 of said units being rental units available to residents of very low-, low-and moderate-income as defined by the New Jersey Fair Housing Act of 1985, as amended; and

WHEREAS, said 15 affordable housing rental units are required to be deed restricted for occupancy of said units by income eligible households; and

WHEREAS, the Uniform Housing Affordability Controls at N.J.A.C. 5:80-26.1 et seq. requires that a deed restriction be filed with the County Clerk for the affordable housing control period for said units which will be for at least 30 years; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Totowa Affordable Housing Planner Robert Hudak, MPA, PP, AICP, InSite Engineering, LLC has reviewed and approved the form and content of the required deed restriction which is attached hereto to this Resolution as Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Totowa wishes to execute said deed restriction so that the 15 affordable housing units will become a component of the Borough of Totowa's Third Round Compliance Program.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Municipal Council of the Borough of Totowa does hereby authorize the Mayor of the Borough of Totowa to execute the above-referenced deed restriction for the 15 affordable housing rental units to be constructed within the Shepherds Lane Commons Development located at 95 Shepherds Lane and officially designated as Block 11, Lot 9.01 on the official Tax Map of the Borough of Totowa.

WHEREAS, Division of Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC) liquor licenses that have been issued by the Borough of Totowa during the 2024 – 2025 license term expired on June 30, 2025; and

WHEREAS, State and Municipal regulations require that ABC liquor licenses be renewed prior to July 1, 2025; and

WHEREAS, state regulations further requires that all licensees must have filed their renewal applications online through POSSE ABC, have received their Alcoholic Beverage Retail Licensee Clearance Certificate and have paid their State and Municipal fees prior to renewing any liquor license; and

WHEREAS, The 46 Lounge, LLC license number 1612-33-002-005 failed to timely file the renewal application and pay the State fee; and

WHEREAS, The 46 Lounge, LLC license number 1612-33-002-005 on July 7, 2025 paid the Municipal fee; and

WHEREAS, The 46 Lounge, LLC license number 1612-33-002-005 on February 13, 2026 submitted the paper renewal application and the State fee to the Borough of Totowa; and

WHEREAS, The 46 Lounge, LLC license number 1612-33-002-005 now requires relief pursuant to N.J.S.A. 33:1-12.18; and

WHEREAS, The 46 Lounge, LLC license number 1612-33-002-005 on February 13, 2026 submitted the Verified Petition and filing fee with the New Jersey Division of Alcoholic Beverage Control; and

WHEREAS, on April 7, 2026 the Director of the New Jersey Division of Alcoholic Beverage Control did grant the relief sought in the Verified Petition; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Totowa may now consider the application for a new license.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Totowa that the Municipal Clerk be authorized to issue a new ABC Plenary Retail Consumption License For 2025 – 2026 License Term to The 46 Lounge, LLC license number 1612-33-002-005 and that the Municipal Clerk upload a copy of this resolution and complete the renewal process on the POSSE ABC website.

WHEREAS, citizens of the Borough of Totowa, along with New Jersey Swim Alliance (“NJSSA”) and New Jersey Recreation & Park Association (“NJRPA”) recognize the vital role that swimming and aquatic-related activities relate to good physical and mental health and enhance the quality of life for all people; and

WHEREAS, the citizens of the Borough of Totowa along with NJSSA and NJRPA understand the essential role that education regarding the topic of Water Safety plays in preventing drownings and recreational water-related injuries; and

WHEREAS, the citizens of the Borough of Totowa along with NJSSA and NJRPA are aware of the contributions made by the recreational water industry, as represented by the organizations involved in the National Water Safety Month Coalition in developing safe swimming facilities, aquatic programs, home pools and spas, and related activities providing healthy places to recreate, learn and grow, build self-esteem, confidence and sense of self-worth which contributes to the quality of life in our community; and

WHEREAS, the citizens of the Borough of Totowa along with NJSSA and NJRPA recognize ongoing efforts and commitments to educate the public on pool and spa safety issues and initiatives by the pool, spa, waterpark, recreation and parks industries; and

WHEREAS, the citizens of the Borough of Totowa along with NJSSA and NJRPA understand the vital importance of communicating Water Safety rules and programs to families and individuals of all ages, whether owners of private pools, users of public swimming facilities or visitors to waterparks.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED, that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Totowa do hereby declare the month of May as
