MINUTES OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL

February 24, 2015

PRESENT: Mayor John Coiro, presiding, Council President Phil Puglise, Councilman Lou D'Angelo, Councilwoman Carolyn Fontanella, Councilwoman Debra Andriani, Councilman Anthony Picarelli, Councilman William Bucher, Municipal Clerk Joseph Wassel and Municipal Attorney Robert Corrado.

ABSENT: None.

Mayor John Coiro called the meeting to order and asked the Municipal Clerk to call the roll.

Municipal Clerk Wassel recited the Prayer of the Meeting followed with the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag with the public participating.

Mayor Coiro asked that everyone remain standing and offer a moment of silence for two residents who passed away recently – Roy Vandebree and Mario Gaita, Sr.

Mayor Coiro asked the Clerk to read the statement of the meeting.

The Municipal Clerk read the following statement: This meeting of the Mayor and Council held on this day is being held in accordance with Chapter 231, P.L. 1975 of the State of New Jersey as amended. The agenda for this meeting has been prepared and distributed to the Mayor and Council and a copy has been on file in the Office of the Municipal Clerk.

There was a motion by Councilman Puglise, seconded by Councilman D'Angelo to dispense with the regular order of business in order to present a proclamation to volunteer fireman Charles Roe and to hold a public hearing on Ordinance No. 05-2015 as advertised. On roll call vote, all members of the Council present voted in the affirmative.

There was a motion by Councilman Puglise, seconded by Councilman D'Angelo to adopt the following Proclamation In Honor Of Fire Fighter Charles Roe. On roll call vote, all members of the Council present voted in the affirmative.

PROCLAMATION IN HONOR OF FIRE FIGHTER CHARLES ROE

WHEREAS, Charlie Roe became a member of the Borough of Totowa Volunteer Fire Department in February of 1965; and

WHEREAS, as a volunteer, Charlie Roe committed to making every effort within his training and ability to assist his fellow residents in our most vulnerable time of need; and

WHEREAS, Charlie Roe has responded to numerous calls at all hours of the day, on weekends and holidays to serve his community and save lives, homes and businesses; and

WHEREAS, during his 50 years of service as a Fire Fighter, Charlie Roe has been a dedicated volunteer rising through the ranks to the positions of Engineer, Lieutenant, Captain, President of Lincoln Fire Company and served 3 terms as Assistant Chief; and

WHEREAS, Charlie Roe is also a member of the Totowa Borough Relief Association and has been a member of the Totowa Borough Fire Department Exempt Association since 1972; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Totowa wish to publicly honor Charlie Roe on his 50th anniversary for his commitment and service to the residents of Totowa.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Totowa, County of Passaic and State of New Jersey do hereby give special recognition to Charlie Roe for his distinguished career as a Volunteer Fire Fighter and devoted service to our community.

WHEREAS, the Superintendent of the Borough of Totowa Department of Public Works (“DPW”) has recommended the purchase of a camera system for the DPW Building and Recycling Facility for security reasons; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Totowa recognize the need for a camera system for the DPW Building and the adjoining Recycling Facility area for the protection and safety of the DPW staff and the members of the community that utilize the Recycling Facility; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Totowa desire to authorize the purchase and installation of a camera system for both the DPW Building and Recycling Facility; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Totowa DPW Superintendent solicited quotes for a camera system for the DPW Building and Recycling Facility; and

WHEREAS, Intruder Alert Alarms, P.O. Box 597, Totowa, New Jersey 07512 has submitted a proposal for the purchase and installation of a camera system for a fee not to exceed the sum of Two Thousand Nine Hundred Ten and 00/100 Dollars (\$2,910.00), a copy of which is on file in the office of the Borough of Totowa Municipal Clerk; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the applicable New Jersey State laws, the authorization of this service will not exceed the public bidding threshold and may be authorized without public bidding.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Totowa do hereby authorize Intruder Alert Alarms to provide and install a camera system in the Borough of Totowa DPW Building and Recycling Facility and provide all related services as set forth in their proposal for a fee not to exceed the sum of Two Thousand Nine Hundred Ten and 00/100 Dollars (\$2,910.00),

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Totowa do hereby authorize the Municipal Clerk to execute any and all necessary instruments relating thereto.

RESOLUTION TO WAIVE INTEREST CHARGES ON A DISPUTED 3RD QUARTER
2014 WATER BILL FOR ACCOUNT NUMBER 595-0, 95 WILLIAM PLACE

WHEREAS, Tonino & Mirna Ciccone are the owners and landlord of property located at 95 William Place and identified as Block 29, Lot 26 on the official Tax Map of the Borough of Totowa; and

WHEREAS, Mirna Ciccone disputed the amount owed for the 3rd Quarter Water Bill for Account Number 595-0 for the property located at 95 William Place; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Totowa Water Department conducted a review of the account history and they examined the existing water meter to make sure it was working accurately; and

WHEREAS, the investigation conducted by the Borough of Totowa Water Department revealed that the amount billed was in fact correct and Mirna Ciccone has agreed to pay the 3rd Quarter Water Bill for Account Number 595-0 in full; and

WHEREAS, interest on the amount owed for the 3rd Quarter Water Bill for Account Number 595-0 continued to accrue during the period of time the account was disputed and reviewed; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Totowa desire to waive the interest due on the amount billed of \$1,298.79 for the 3rd Quarter Water Bill for Account Number 595-0 for 95 Williams Place for a period of sixty (60) days

WHEREAS, the scope of work for the aforementioned project remains identical to that which was discussed at the public hearing held on February 25, 2014.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Totowa do hereby confirm endorsement of the aforesaid project.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Council certify the resolution for the application to be presented to the Passaic County Department of Planning.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this resolution shall be sent to the Department of Planning and be included in the application by the Borough for the 2015 Open Space and Farmland Preservation Trust Fund, so that implementation of the aforesaid project may be expedited.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING CONTRACT FOR TECHNICAL BASIS OF RFP FOR THE NORTH JERSEY DEVELOPMENTAL CENTER SITE

WHEREAS, in July of 2014, the State of New Jersey permanently closed the North Jersey Developmental Center ("NJDC") facilities located at 169 Minnisink Road, Totowa, New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, in order to make a determination as to the viability and future use of the NJDC site, it will be necessary to undertake a thorough review and environmental assessment of the property which includes approximately 188 acres located within the Borough of Totowa; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Totowa desire to retain the services of a professional firm to prepare a Technical Basis for Requests for Proposals ("RFP") for the NJDC site; and

WHEREAS, the tasks associated with the preparation of the Technical Basis include but are not limited to preparing a Preliminary Assessment Report, conducting an Asbestos Containing Building Materials survey for all of the existing structures, preparing an Environmental Opportunities and Constraints Analysis, outlining land redevelopment opportunities for the site and preparing the RFP document; and

WHEREAS, Alaimo Group Consulting Engineers, 200 High Street, Mt. Holly, New Jersey 08060 has submitted a proposal to provide the required professional services and technical assistance for a fee not to exceed the sum of Fifty Thousand and 00/100 Dollars (\$50,000.00), a copy of which is on file in the office of the Borough of Totowa Municipal Clerk; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Totowa on February 24, 2015 did examine the proposal submitted by Alaimo Group Consulting Engineers; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the applicable New Jersey State laws, these professional services may be authorized without public bidding.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Totowa do hereby authorize the Borough of Totowa to enter into a contract with Alaimo Group Consulting Engineers to prepare the Technical Basis for the RFP for the NJDC site in the amount of Fifty Thousand and 00/100 Dollars (\$50,000.00).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Municipal Council of the Borough of Totowa does hereby authorize the Mayor and Municipal Clerk to execute any and all necessary instruments relating thereto.
