MINUTES OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL

March 12, 2013

PRESENT: Mayor John Coiro, presiding, Councilman John Waryas, Councilman Lou D'Angelo, Councilwoman Carolyn Fontanella, Councilwoman Debra Andriani, Councilman Anthony Picarelli, Municipal Clerk Joseph Wassel and Municipal Attorney Robert Corrado.

ABSENT: Council President Phil Puglise.

Mayor John Coiro called the meeting to order and asked the Municipal Clerk to call the roll.

Municipal Clerk Wassel recited the Prayer of the Meeting followed with the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag with the public participating.

Mayor Coiro asked the Clerk to read the statement of the meeting.

The Municipal Clerk read the following statement: This meeting of the Mayor and Council held on this day is being held in accordance with Chapter 231, P.L. 1975 of the State of New Jersey as amended. The agenda for this meeting has been prepared and distributed to the Mayor and Council and a copy has been on file in the Office of the Municipal Clerk.

There was a motion by Councilman Waryas, seconded by Councilman D'Angelo to dispense with the regular order of business in order to hold a public hearing on the 2013 Passaic County Open Space and Farmland Preservation Trust Fund grant applications for completion of drainage improvements to the Lincoln Fields and for the construction of a tennis court at The PAL. On roll call vote, all members of the Council present voted in the affirmative.

Municipal Clerk Wassel announced that the 2013 Open Space grant applications have been advertised for public hearing for Tuesday, March 12, 2013.

Municipal Clerk Wassel read the Open Space Public Hearing Notice.

There was a motion by Councilman Waryas, seconded by Councilman D'Angelo to open the public hearing. On roll call vote, all members of the Council present voted in the affirmative.

Mayor Coiro asked if any citizens wished to be heard on the 2013 Open Space grant applications.

CITIZENS HEARD:

Mike Mahometa, 269 Lincoln Avenue: Asked if the engineer was at the PAL fields today during the rainstorm because it was flooded and the area behind Lincoln Fields 1 & 2 was like a river. He said the catch basin behind home plate doesn't work and commented that if the new system will be going into the existing system it won't work. Interim DPW Superintendent Jim Niland: Reported that Mike was talking about the drainage behind Lincoln Fields 1 & 2 and stated that the drainage in that area is bad, but that the new drainage lines that we installed by Lincoln Field 90 recently—with a prior Open Space Grant—and drains out to Lincoln Avenue works well. He also acknowledged that some of the catch basins will have to be lowered to catch the rain water. Mayor Coiro: Asked Mr. Mahometa, for the record, whether or not he was in favor of the Borough of Totowa pursuing this grant. Mr. Mahometa: Responded, yes 100% in favor of the Borough applying for this Open Space Grant.

There was a motion by Councilman Waryas, seconded by Councilman D'Angelo to close the public hearing. On roll call vote, all members of the Council present voted in the affirmative.

There was a motion by Councilman Waryas, seconded by Councilman D'Angelo to adopt the following resolution endorsing submission of the 2013 Passaic County Open Space and Farmland Preservation Trust Fund grant application for the completion of drainage improvements to the Lincoln Fields at the PAL. Mayor Coiro: Thanked the Fire Department and asked Fire Chief Vince Marciano to pass his thanks along to all our volunteers who once again fought bravely and kept the fire on Greene Avenue under control and from spreading to other residences. Stated that our firefighters acted professionally and he appreciates their efforts. Also remarked that after back to back fires on Lincoln Avenue and Greene Avenue, he hopes that the fires are done.

Councilwoman Fontanella: Announced that our lawmakers in Trenton will once again revisit the decision to close the North Jersey Developmental Center. Mayor Coiro: Expressed that he hopes better judgment will prevail.

Councilwoman Andriani: Announced that the Board of Recreation held their Skate Night last Friday night at the Ice Vault and said it was very successful. Said the Easter Bunny Breakfast will be held on Saturday, March 23rd at Washington Park School and tickets are still available. Disclosed that Borough Nurse Darlene Walsh will assist with St. James Church's 20th Annual Blood Drive which will be held on Good Friday, March 29, 2013.

There were no citizens who wished to be heard.

RESOLUTION NO. 41-2013

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING EXECUTION OF THE CONSENT DECREE FOR THE SETTLEMENT WITH STATE PLAINTIFFS IN THE ACTION ENTITLED NEW JERSEY DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION V. OCCIDENTAL CHEMICAL CORPORATION, ET AL.

WHEREAS, certain claims have been asserted against the Borough of Totowa (the "Borough") in the action entitled New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection v. Occidental Chemical Corporation, et al., Docket No. ESX-L-9868-05 pending in the Superior Court of New Jersey, Essex County (the "Litigation") regarding alleged environmental contamination at the Newark Bay Complex ("Newark Bay Complex"); and

WHEREAS, certain Third-Party Defendant Municipalities and municipal utilities authorities, including the Borough of Totowa, are members of a group known as the Municipal Joint Defense Group in the Litigation; and

WHEREAS, the Municipal Joint Defense Group on behalf of its members engaged in settlement negotiations with the State of New Jersey (State "Plaintiffs") towards the resolution of the Litigation through the entry of a Consent Judgment; and

WHEREAS, the parties have substantially settled the Litigation and are presently negotiating the final details of the Consent Judgment; and

WHEREAS, the terms of the settlement require the Borough of Totowa to pass a resolution authorizing its participation in the settlement and authorizing the appropriation of the payment in the sum of \$95,000.00 representing the Settlement Funds as that term is defined by the Consent Judgment on or before March 23, 2013; and

WHEREAS, a copy of the Consent Judgment is on file in the office of the Clerk and is incorporated by reference hereto:

1. The Borough of Totowa is hereby authorized and directed to sign the signature pages of the Consent Judgment which will be adopted in substantially the form contained in the draft copy on file and thereafter immediately transmit said signature pages to Gregory J. Coffey, Esq.
2. The Borough of Totowa hereby authorizes the payment of the \$95,000.00 settlement amount, when due, in the manner provided for in the Consent Judgment.
3. Notwithstanding the above authorizations, nothing contained within this Resolution shall preclude or prevent the Borough from pursuing recovery and reimbursement for the whole or any portion of the Settlement Funds from any insurance carrier(s) identified now or in the future.
4. This Resolution shall take effect immediately.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE PURCHASE AND DELIVERY OF
ONE MAGNUM DRY PRIME DIESEL TRASH PUMP

WHEREAS, the Interim Superintendent for the Borough of Totowa Department of Public Works ("DPW") is in need a new pump for operations; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Totowa solicited proposals from for the purchase and delivery of one (1) magnum dry prime diesel trash pump in accordance with the specifications entitled "Specifications and Proposal for the Purchase and Delivery of One Magnum Dry Prime Diesel Trash Pump for the Borough of Totowa, County of Passaic, New Jersey, 2013"; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Totowa did receive bids at its Municipal Building on February 21, 2013; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Totowa on February 26, 2013 did examine all bids for the equipment called for; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Totowa have determined that the lowest responsible bid was submitted by Pumping Services, Inc., 201 Lincoln Avenue, Middlesex, New Jersey 08846 in the amount of Thirty-Eight Thousand Four Hundred Four and 00/100 Dollars (\$38,404.00), a copy of which is on file in the office of the Municipal Clerk; and

WHEREAS, the Interim Superintendent for the Borough of Totowa Department of Public Works has reviewed the bid and recommended the purchase of this equipment for the Department of Public Works; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Totowa have determined that the bid submitted by Pumping Services, Inc. be accepted as the lowest responsible bid.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Totowa do hereby accept the bid of Pumping Services, Inc. for the purchase and delivery of one (1) magnum dry prime diesel trash pump as the lowest responsible bid for the total sum of Thirty-Eight Thousand Four Hundred Four and 00/100 Dollars (\$38,404.00).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Municipal Council of the Borough of Totowa does hereby authorize the Mayor and Municipal Clerk to execute any and all necessary instruments relating thereto.

RESOLUTION NO.43-2013

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING CONTRACT FOR
GEESE CONTROL SERVICES FOR 2013

WHEREAS, the Borough of Totowa Board of Recreation has recommended that the Borough of Totowa hire a qualified company to provide safe and effective geese clearing and control services at all of the Borough of Totowa recreational ball fields; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Totowa have also determined that there is a need to retain a company that can provide these services to ensure the health and well-being of the residents of the Borough of Totowa; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Totowa Board of Recreation has solicited quotes for the necessary geese control services; and

WHEREAS, Geese Chasers North Jersey, 1 Stevens Avenue, Tinton Falls, New Jersey 07724 submitted a proposal dated February 27, 2013 to clear and maintain a virtually geese-free environment with the use of working border collies, a copy of which is on file in the office of the Borough of Totowa Municipal Clerk; and

WHEREAS, Geese Chasers North Jersey will provide these services to the Borough of Totowa on an as needed basis for a term not to exceed a period of one (1) year; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the applicable New Jersey State laws, the contract for these services may be authorized without public bidding since the total contract price will not exceed the public bidding threshold.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Totowa do hereby authorize a contract with Geese Chasers North Jersey for all necessary geese control services in accordance with the fee schedule set forth in their proposal.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Municipal Council of the Borough of Totowa does hereby authorize the Mayor and Municipal Clerk to execute any and all instruments relating thereto.

There was a motion by Councilwoman Andriani, seconded by Councilman Picarelli to adopt the following Resolution Authorizing Contract For Fertilizer And Weed Control Services For 2013. On roll call vote, all members of the Council present voted in the affirmative.

RESOLUTION NO. 44-2013

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING CONTRACT FOR FERTILIZER
AND WEED CONTROL SERVICES FOR 2013

WHEREAS, the Interim Superintendent for the Borough of Totowa Department of Public Works has recommended the Borough of Totowa implement a fertilization and weed control treatment program for the Borough of Totowa Municipal Complex grounds, recreational parks and fields; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Totowa Department of Public Works did solicit proposals for these lawn maintenance services; and

WHEREAS, Harvest Lawn Care, P.O. Box 643, Franklin Lakes, New Jersey 07105 has submitted a proposal to provide the necessary fertilization and weed control services in the amount of Twelve Thousand Three Hundred Twenty-Eight and 00/100 Dollars (\$12,328.00), a copy of which is on file in the office of the Borough of Totowa Municipal Clerk; and

WHEREAS, the Interim Superintendent for the Borough of Totowa Department of Public Works has reviewed the proposal and recommended the Borough of Totowa implement the five (5) step treatment plan recommended in the proposal; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the applicable New Jersey State laws, the authorization of this service will not exceed the public bidding threshold and may be authorized without public bidding.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Totowa do hereby authorize the Borough of Totowa to enter into a contract with Harvest Lawn Care for fertilizer and weed control services for the Borough of Totowa Municipal Complex grounds, recreational fields and parks in the amount of Twelve Thousand Three Hundred Twenty-Eight and 00/100 Dollars (\$12,328.00).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Totowa do hereby authorize the Municipal Clerk and Interim Superintendent for the Department of Public Works to execute any and all necessary instruments relating thereto.

A letter was received from Sanitary Inspector Steve Shayne requesting a Medical Leave of Absence. There was a motion by Councilwoman Andriani, seconded by Councilman Picarelli to approve the request. On roll call vote, all members of the Council present voted in the affirmative.

COMMITTEE ON LEGISLATION & ORDINANCES:

There was a motion by Councilman Picarelli, seconded by Councilwoman Andriani to adopt the following Resolution Opposing Senate Bill S-2364 And Assembly Bill A-3553. On roll call vote, all members of the Council present voted in the affirmative.

RESOLUTION NO. 45-2013

RESOLUTION OPPOSING SENATE BILL S-2364
AND ASSEMBLY BILL A-3553

WHEREAS, Senate Bill S-2364 and Assembly Bill A-3553 propose to create a system of early voting in the State of New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, the goal of accommodating voters in pursuit of greater participation in the democratic process is a worthy goal; and

WHEREAS, these bills would in reality increase workloads, add more costs to the election process, and ultimately serve to confuse voters more than it would accommodate their needs; and

WHEREAS, these bills would require for each primary and general election a public facility, except a public school, located in each municipality in an area of a high concentration of population to be open and available to registered voters starting 15 days before an election for early polling, possibly conflicting with if not pushing out other important uses for these buildings, causing inconvenience to residents; and

WHEREAS, these bills require retraining of poll workers and dramatically increased hours, as well as chain of custody requirements to protect the voting process, despite the fact that recruiting and training poll workers is already a difficult process; and

WHEREAS, these bills would increase costs to municipalities, including overtime pay for workers; and

WHEREAS, although these bills allow municipalities to request reimbursement for extra costs and provide an appropriation, the appropriation does not outline a specific amount nor dedicated funding, only that which the State Treasurer and the Director of the Division of Budget and Accounting deem necessary, and they do not outline the procedure for a municipality whose reimbursement request is denied; and

WHEREAS, the opportunity for "Early Voting" already exists in the State of New Jersey through the Vote by Mail ballot process.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Governing Body of the Borough of Totowa, in the County of Passaic does hereby oppose S-2364 and A-3553.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Governing Body of the Borough of Totowa does hereby call upon its representatives in the State Legislature to oppose the adoption of these bills.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this Resolution shall be sent to the Office of the Governor, Senate President Sweeney, Senators Gill and Whelan, sponsors of S-2364, Speaker Oliver, Assemblymen Wisniewski, Diegnan, Benson, Conaway, and Coughlin, sponsors of A-3553, our State Senator and Assembly representatives, the Passaic County Board of Elections, the Passaic County Clerk and the New Jersey League of Municipalities.

There was a motion by Councilman Picarelli, seconded by Councilwoman Andriani to adopt the following Proclamation In Honor Of The Most Reverend Harry J. Flynn. On roll call vote, all members of the Council present voted in the affirmative.

PROCLAMATION IN HONOR OF THE MOST REVEREND HARRY J. FLYNN

WHEREAS, Harry Joseph Flynn was born in Schenectady, New York in 1933 and was ordained a priest for the Diocese of Albany in 1960, was consecrated the coadjutor Bishop for the Diocese of Lafayette in Louisiana in 1986 and served as the Bishop of the Diocese from 1989 until 1994; and

WHEREAS, he was appointed coadjutor Archbishop of Saint Paul and Minneapolis in 1994 and became the Diocese's seventh Archbishop on September 8, 1995 serving until his retirement in 2008; and

WHEREAS, Archbishop Harry J. Flynn has served as a high school teacher, Pastor, Seminary Professor, Seminary Rector and Director of Continuing Education for the Clergy; and

WHEREAS, Archbishop Flynn is Chairman of the University of Saint Thomas Board of Trustees, Saint Paul, Minnesota, Member of the Board of Trustees of the College of Saint Catherine and the Catholic University of America and he is also on numerous national boards of the National Catholic Conference of Bishops and is the recipient of seven honorary doctorate degrees; and

WHEREAS, Archbishop Flynn is a most sought after retreat master, speaker and confessor and will be speaking at all masses at St. James of the Marches on March 16 and March 17, 2013 and will be celebrating Mass, preaching and hearing confessions on March 18 and March 19, 2013; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Totowa wish to publicly honor Archbishop Harry Flynn as he shares his insight, wisdom and experience with the parishioners of St. James and the residents of Totowa.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Totowa, County of Passaic and State of New Jersey do hereby give special recognition to the Most Reverend Harry J. Flynn for his distinguished career, his devotion to Catholic education and his ministry on social justice.

BE IT FURTHER PROCLAIMED that this Proclamation be made a part of the permanent records of the Borough of Totowa and that a copy of said Proclamation be presented to Archbishop Harry J. Flynn.

There being no further business to come before the Council, there was a motion by Councilman Waryas, seconded by Councilman D'Angelo that the meeting be adjourned. On roll call vote, all members of the Council present voted in the affirmative.
