Mayor John Coiro called the meeting to order and asked the Municipal Clerk to call the roll.

Municipal Clerk Wassel recited the Prayer of the Meeting followed with the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag with the public participating.

Mayor Coiro asked the Clerk to read the statement of the meeting.

Municipal Clerk Wassel read the following statement: This meeting of the Mayor and Council held on this day is being held in accordance with Chapter 231, P.L. 1975 of the State of New Jersey as amended. The agenda for this meeting has been prepared and distributed to the Mayor and Council and a copy has been on file in the Office of the Municipal Clerk.

There was a motion by Councilman Picarelli, seconded by Councilman Bucher to dispense with the regular order of business in order to hold a public hearing on Ordinance No. 05-2023 as advertised. On roll call vote, all members of the Council present voted in the affirmative.

Municipal Clerk Wassel announced that Ordinance No. 05-2023 has been advertised for public hearing for Tuesday, April 25, 2023.

Municipal Clerk Wassel read the legal notice and the title of Ordinance No. 05-2023.

There was a motion by Councilman Picarelli, seconded by Councilman Bucher to open the public hearing. On roll call vote, all members of the Council present voted in the affirmative.

There was a motion by Councilman Picarelli, seconded by Councilman Capo to adopt the following Resolution Authorizing The Mayor To Sign The Certification To Comply With The Requirements Set Forth In N.J.A.C. 7:26A-11. On roll call vote, all members of the Council present voted in the affirmative.

RESOLUTION NO. 53-2023

WHEREAS, the Clean Communities and Recycling Act of 1981 created the Municipal Tonnage Grant (MTG) program, whereby municipalities could receive a grant for the amount of materials documented as being recycled during the previous calendar year; and

WHEREAS, in 1987, the New Jersey Statewide Mandatory Source Separation and Recycling Act, specifically N.J.S.A. 13:1E-99.16, mandated the governing body of each municipality to submit an annual Recycling Tonnage Report summarizing the amount of material recycled during the previous calendar year; and

WHEREAS, in January 2008, the Recycling Enhancement Act (REA), N.J.S.A. 13:1E-96, specifically P.L. 2007, c. 311, reestablished funding for local recycling programs through a tax of \$3.00 per ton on all solid waste accepted for disposal or transfer at solid waste facilities in New Jersey except those designed exclusively to transport waste by railroad (N.J.S.A. 13:1E-96.5); and

WHEREAS, the REA requires that a Certified Recycling Coordinator (CRC-sometimes referred to as a Certified Recycling Professional-CRP) certify recycling tonnage reports, specifies that grants received may only be expended on recycling (N.J.S.A. 13:1E-96(b)1) and that the amount of grant monies received by the municipality shall not be less than the annual amount of recycling tax paid by the municipality (N.J.S.A. 13:1E-96(b)1); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 13:1E-96a, the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP), Division of Solid and Hazardous Waste (DSHW) administers the MTG program; and

WHEREAS, the DEP implemented several changes to the program beginning with the 2017 MTG application, and whereby now a complete 2022 MTG application consists of: a 2022 Recycling Tonnage Report; an Expenditure Report for 2019 MTG funds; a statement that the municipality complied in calendar year 2022 with the Standards for Municipalities and intends to comply with same in calendar year 2023; a statement that the Municipal Recycling Coordinator (MRC) complied with the program requirements during calendar year 2022 and intends to comply with same during calendar year 2023.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Municipal Council of the Borough of Totowa, County of Passaic, New Jersey does hereby authorize Mayor John Coiro to sign the Certification of Compliance (N.J.A.C. 7:26A-11 "Standards for Municipalities").

RESOLUTION NO. 54-2023

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING EMERGENCY REPAIRS TO THE SANITARY SEWER LINE ALONG TOTOWA ROAD AT 640 TOTOWA ROAD

WHEREAS, the Superintendent of the Borough of Totowa Department of Public Works ("DPW") has advised the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Totowa that the sanitary sewer line located along Totowa Road at 640 Totowa Road needed to be repaired and/or replaced as soon as possible; and

WHEREAS, the nearby home located at 640 Totowa Road is also serviced by this sanitary sewer line and was experiencing on-going sewer back-ups as a result of the damaged piping; and

WHEREAS, the necessary repairs to the sanitary sewer line included but were not limited to excavating to the existing sewer line, removing and disposing of the damaged piping; and installing 35 linear feet of new 8" sewer main piping; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Totowa DPW Superintendent solicited quotes from companies experienced in sanitary sewer repairs; and

WHEREAS, Regal Utility Services, Inc., 731 Warwick Turnpike, Hewitt, New Jersey 07421 submitted a proposal for the removal and replacement of the sanitary sewer line in the amount of \$16,000.00, a copy of which is on file on the office of the Borough of Totowa Municipal Clerk; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Totowa desire to authorize these necessary repairs along Totowa Road at 640 Totowa Road for the general health, safety and well-being of the residents of the Borough of Totowa; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:11-6, the repairs and replacement of this sewer line constitutes an emergency service that may be authorized by the Borough of Totowa without public bidding.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Totowa do hereby accept the proposal submitted by Regal Utility Services, Inc. for the removal and replacement of the sanitary sewer line along Totowa Road at 640 Totowa Road in the amount of \$16,000.00.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Totowa do hereby authorize Regal Utility Services, Inc. to provide the labor and materials for the emergency repairs to the sanitary sewer line along Totowa Road at 640 Totowa Road as set forth in their proposal.
